

### **Code of Conduct – Learners**

Grade RR - 7 parents and learners are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, pages 14 and 20 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

## Section L: Discipline

- 1. Learners earning merits for good behaviour and hard work will contribute 5 points to their respective houses (Apollo, Gemini and Mariner) and those learners receiving offences for not doing homework or misbehaving will lose 3 points for their respective houses. House points are announced to the learners in assembly every week. The house with the most points at the end of the term wins the inter-house trophy. House Captains have the responsibility to inspire the learners who are part of their respective houses by doing messages and quotes in assembly and over the intercom.
- 2. Homework class is an intervention strategy to assist a learner when they are not meeting the promotion requirements.
- 3. Three (3) offences will result in a learner having to attend 2nd break detention for a week.
- 4. Five (5) offences will result in a learner having to attend Friday afternoon homework class.
- 5. Homework class finishes at 15:00 on a Friday afternoon.
- 6. Homework class is compulsory and is viewed in a very serious light. Children are expected to adhere to the dates and times for homework class.
- 7. Parents must sign and ensure that the child returns the homework class slip to the relevant teacher.
- 8. Parents are to ensure that their child attends the relevant homework class and must ensure that they are collected promptly after the session.
- 9. Eight (8) offences will result in a learner having to stand in the foyer of the School hall for a period to be determined by the severity of the offences.
- 10. Ten (10) offences will result in an intervention meeting with all the relevant parties concerned.
- 11. Intervention meetings will be conducted for repeated offences in terms of homework and bad / inappropriate behaviour.







# MISCONDUCT OF LEARNERS AT PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

Published under General Notice 6903 of 2000 (Pg. 144 of 2000) as amended by General Notice 2591 of 2001

### Section 5: Procedure for hearing of serious misconduct

- 5.1 A learner charged with serious misconduct is entitled to a hearing adjudicated upon by the disciplinary committee.
- 5.2 A learner charged with serious misconduct must be given no less than 5 (five) School days written notice of the hearing into the alleged misconduct, unless
- a). the governing body directs, with good cause, that a shorter notice period shall apply;
- b). there is no prejudice caused to the learner by the shorter notice period
- 5.3 The notice contemplated in subparagraph (2) must -
- a). contain sufficient particularity of the date, place and nature of the alleged serious misconduct to enable the learner to identify the incident in question and to respond thereto;
- b). inform the learner of the charges, place, date and time of the hearing;
- c). inform the learner of provisional suspension, if any, the reasons therefore and any other matter required in connection with the provisional suspension; and
- d), inform the learner of the rights of a learner in terms hereof.
- 5.4 The principal must give the notice contemplated in subparagraph (2) to the learner and deliver a copy thereof to the parents of the learner at the address of the learner as indicated in the School register.
- 5.5 At least one of the parents of the learner must accompany the learner at the hearing, unless the learner is 21 years old or older.

# Last week to take out books!




# Reading competition

# Lost or damaged books





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

We are very pleased to introduce you to the Karri Card.

### A Mastercard for students

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases at school and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control not offered by a normal bank card:

- Sign up easily without the need for a birth certificate
- Set daily spending limits
- Rest easy knowing inappropriate merchants such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are blocked (T&Cs for details)
- Multi-parent functionality which allows both parents to manage cards

**Opt in process:** Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

**Fees:** Monthly card fees are R39pm for 1 card, R68pm for 2 cards, or R87pm for 3 cards (Incl. VAT). To streamline billing, the first three months will be billed upfront. A 2.5% instant top up fee applies.




