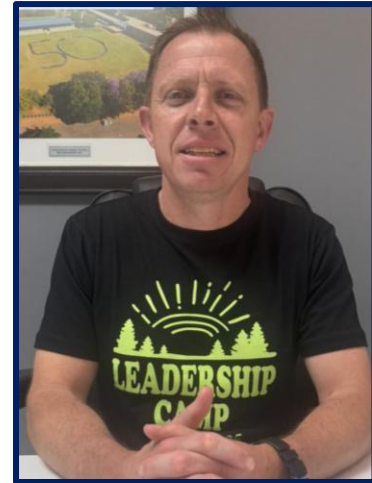

Annual General Meeting

A special word of thank you to all the Grade RR - 7 parents who attended the AGM on Wednesday 15 October. Mrs. Gana, the Vice Chairperson of the School Governing Body presented the proposed budget for the 2026 academic year which was well received by our parents. Grade 1 - 7 school fees will increase by 6.04% next year and Grade RR & R by 6.31%. Aftercare fees will increase by 5%. Below is a breakdown of the fees that will be charged next year and applicable discounts when parents are able to pay fees for the year in advance:

Code of Conduct – Learners

Grade RR - 7 parents and learners are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, pages 12 & 14 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

Section D: Uniform General

1. A learner must always be dressed neatly and correctly in a clean uniform, especially when out in public.
2. The School Uniform, physical education clothes and tracksuit must be neat, clean, uncreased, in good repair and of appropriate size at all times. If the uniform is not maintained and colours have bleached or faded, the uniform needs to be replaced and may not be worn at all.
3. If the uniform is torn, it may not be worn until it is repaired or replaced.
4. Children may not wear make-up, nail varnish or jewellery.



Section I: Punctuality

1. The school day is carefully planned to maximize the time available for teaching and extra-murals. Late arrivals to class cause undesirable disruption of the teaching process, as well as other School activities. Consequently, learners must arrive at the set time for commencement of School each day, including each class activity and assembly. The learner must furnish a note from his / her parents explaining late arrival for the commencement of School.
2. Five (5) Points will be deducted from a learner's House (Mariner, Apollo, Gemini) when he / she is a regular latecomer.

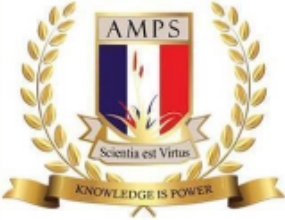

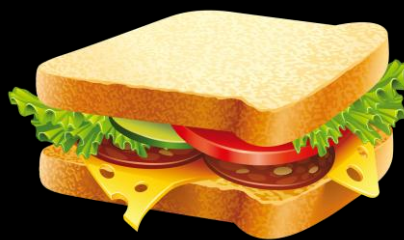

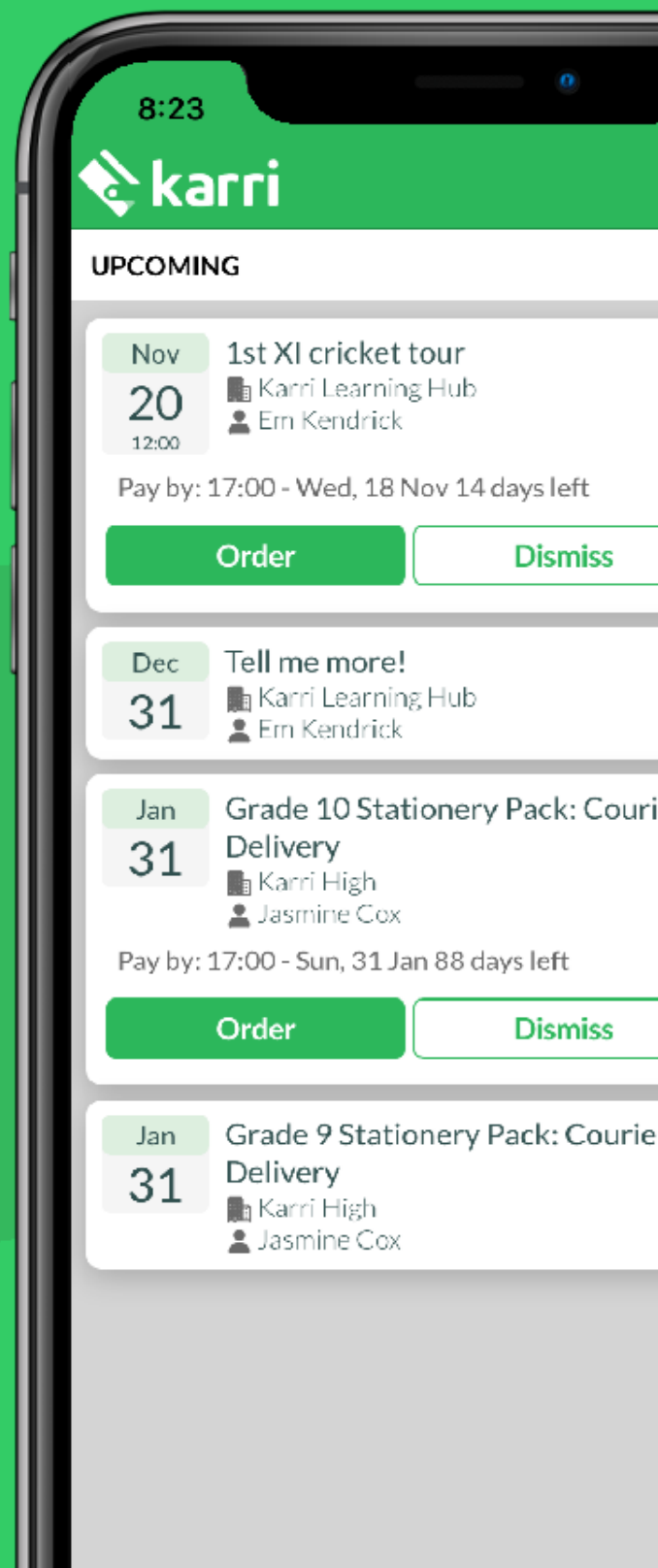

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

Opt in process: Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

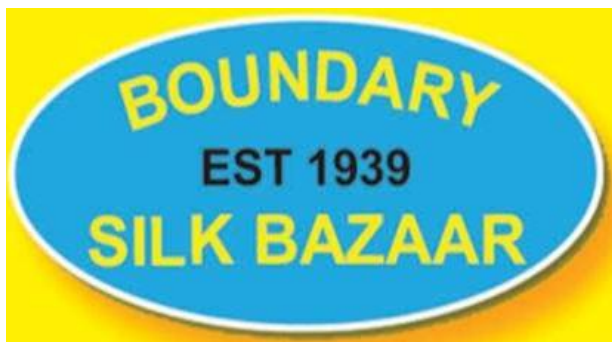

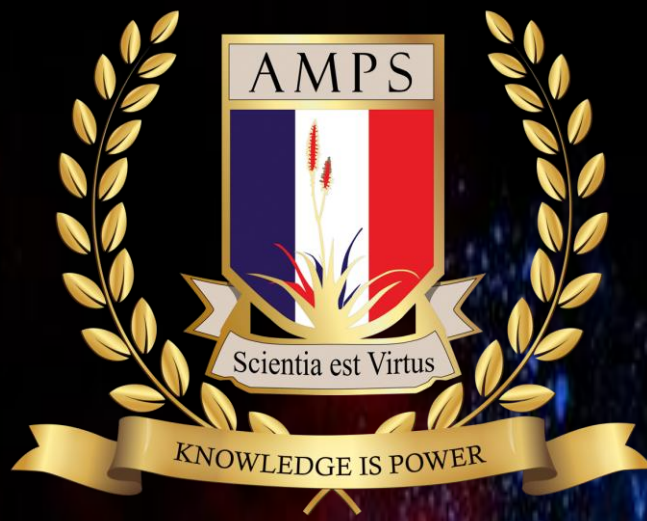
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
