Code of Conduct - Learners

Grade RR - 7 parents are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, page 16 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

Section F: Accessories

1. GIRLS ONLY -- earrings -- only one pair of plain studs / sleepers in gold or silver are permitted to be worn in the earlobe ONLY.
2. No other jewellery of any kind may be worn.
3. No other body piercings or tattoos are permitted (may not be visible).
4. BOYS may not wear any kind of jewellery.
5. Boys and girls' nails must be short and clean.



Section L: Conduct - General

15. Learners must display courtesy, good manners and respect to staff members, fellow learners, parents and the public at all times. Bullying and racism in any form will not be tolerated. If experiencing any form of above mentioned - do not retaliate in kind but report the incident to the class teacher, teacher on duty or the office as soon as possible. A formal disciplinary hearing may be conducted to determine if the incident constitutes bullying or racism.
16. Food stuffs may not be eaten in the classrooms, toilets, the hall or on the corridors, staircases, tarred and paved areas.
17. No chewing of bubble gum is allowed, even on "casual" days.
18. NO littering of any kind is allowed. All litter is to be disposed of in the blue bins. Papers are to be picked up at all times.
19. Learners must obey the scholar patrol when crossing the road and must cross the street at the marked off crossings in controllable groups.
20. Grade 1 to 3 - no chips or sweets are allowed from Monday to Thursday. This is only allowed on a Friday at second break. Birthdays - please send in individually packed snacks / cupcakes for your child's birthday. Delivery to office must be no later than 09:30 in the morning.

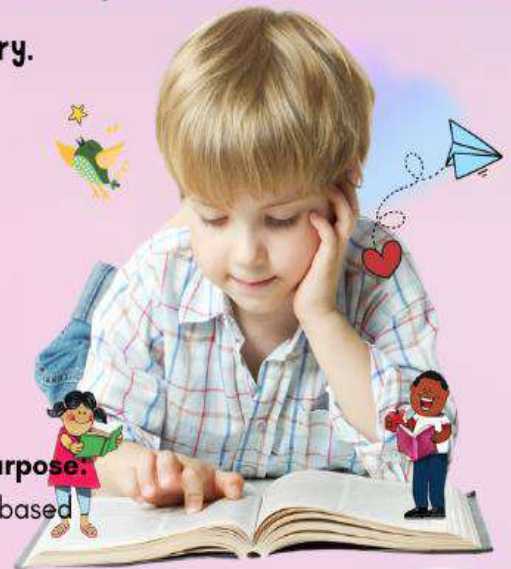
It was World Read Aloud Day on Wednesday 4th February 2026.

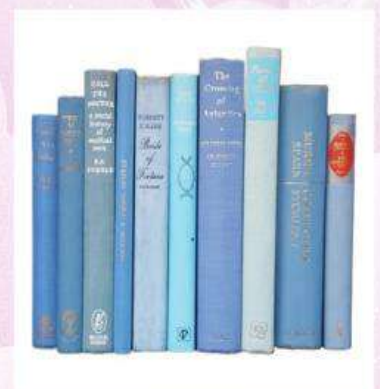
How did World Read Aloud Day start ?

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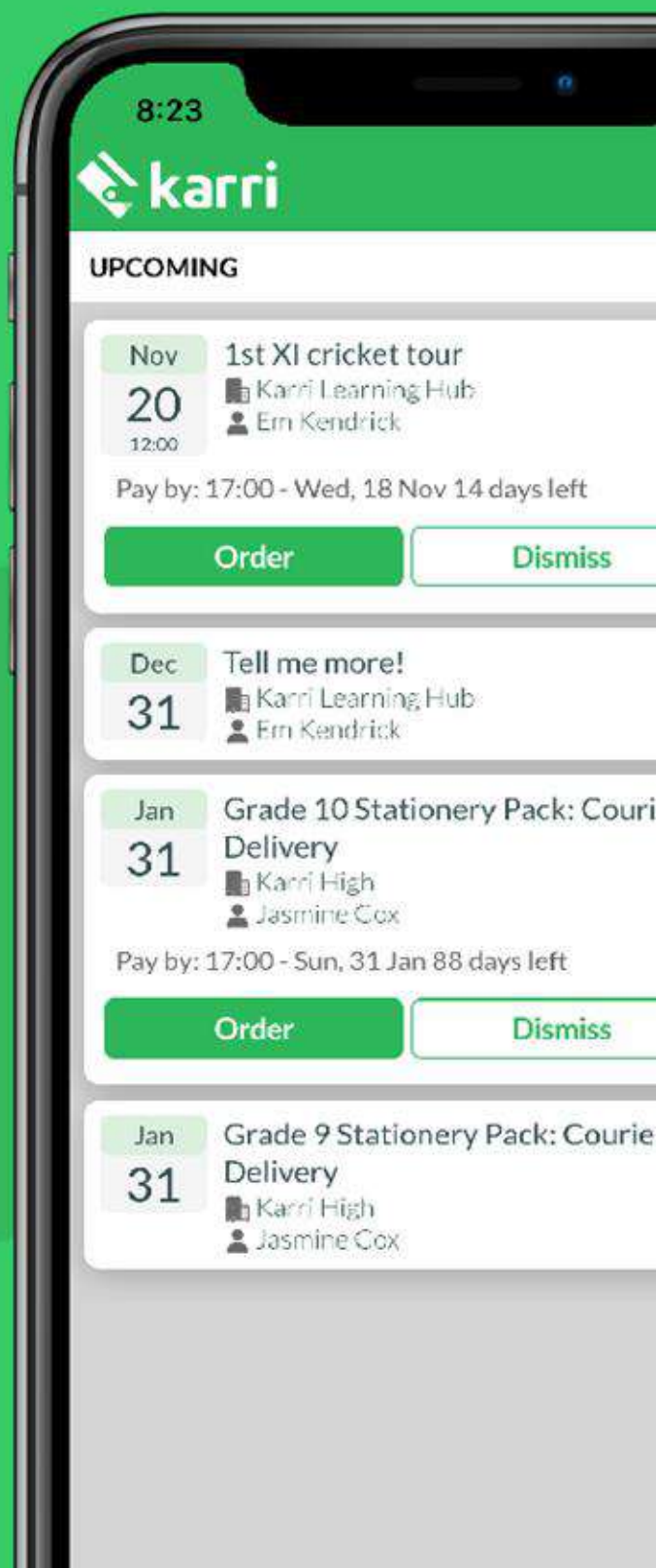

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

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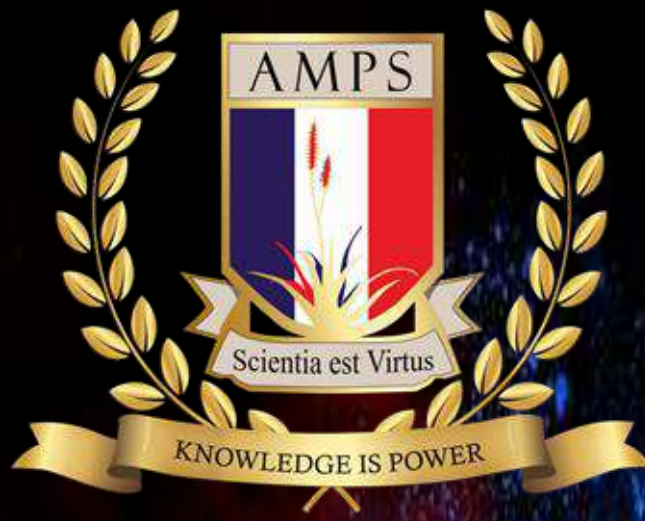
