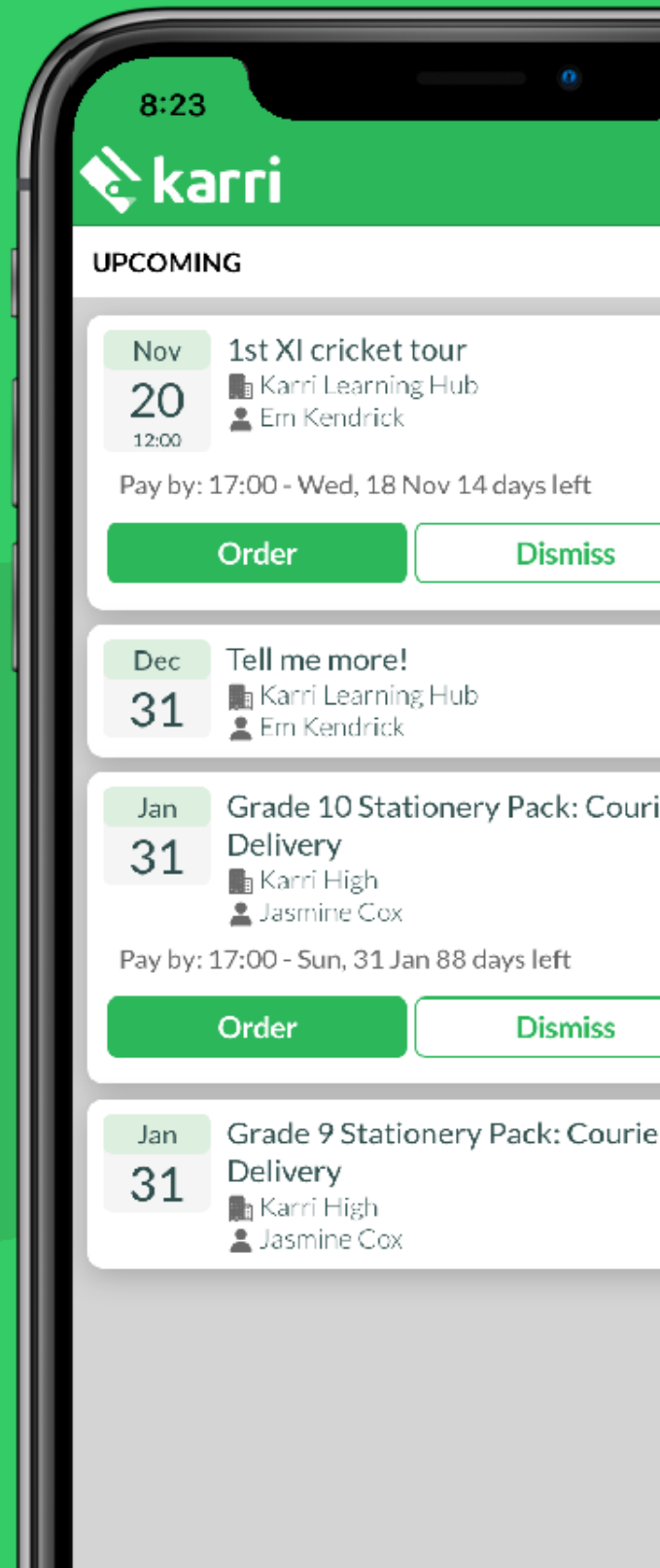

Dear Parents

We are very pleased to introduce you to the **Karri Card**.

A Mastercard for students

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

Opt in process: Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

Fees: Monthly card fees are R39pm for 1 card, R68pm for 2 cards, or R87pm for 3 cards (Incl. VAT). To streamline billing, the first three months will be billed upfront. A 2.5% instant top up fee applies.

Card distribution: Cards will be handed out in class or available at reception on the distribution day. Distribution will take place within about 5 working days after the collection closes. Parents will receive an email when cards are ready.

SA ID required: Due to local regulations, the Karri Card can only be activated by a parent with a SA ID number. Karri is working to offer the card to international parents in the future.

Code of Conduct - Learners

Grade RR - 7 parents and learners are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, pages 12, 16 & 17 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

Section A: School Uniform, page 12

1. Winter uniform is the same for both boys and girls. Long navy trousers, long sleeved white school shirt, navy school socks and standard black school shoes.
2. Girls may wear navy blue woollen stockings with their school dress and school jersey, during winter only.
3. Learners may wear plain navy gloves, AMPS scarves and beanies in winter - however, they may not be worn indoors. No earmuffs are permitted.
4. The navy school jersey, navy drimac with badge or navy blazer with badge may be worn with the winter uniform.
5. Learners may never write on their school clothes or have someone else write on them.
6. School shoes for boys and girls are obtainable from most suppliers. Parents must ensure that they purchase the correct school shoes - no huge silver buckles or large heels allowed.
7. Learners are permitted to wear their current provincial colours tracksuit on **Mondays ONLY**.

Section L: Conduct - General, page 16

1. Remember that it is your attitude and not your aptitude that counts!
2. Merits and commendations are awarded to learners for continual good behaviour as well as displaying a positive attitude towards AMPS.
3. Whether in or out of uniform, learners shall conduct themselves in such a manner to bring credit to Aston Manor Primary School.
4. Learners must leave ablution facilities in a neat and clean condition. They shall NOT block any drain or toilet pan with paper or any other material or substance and shall not open a tap and leave it running.
5. Any conduct or omission which may lead to or have the potential of creating a health hazard for other learners must be avoided.
6. Learners shall comply with the reasonable instructions of the Principal or any staff member regarding the maintenance of a clean, hygienic school environment.
7. Learners may not be in possession of any form of pornography, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, vapes, cannabis or weapons.
8. If it is suspected that a learner is under the influence of drugs / alcohol, said child will be removed from class and further steps will be taken.

Section L: Conduct - General, page 17

29. All tests and homework sent home must be signed by the parent and returned to School.
30. Parents are required to check their children's homework daily and to sign their child's homework diary daily.
31. Learners are to ensure that parents receive any documents, circulars, merits and offences issued by the school. Merits and Offences must be signed and dated by the parents.
32. If the learner loses the Official School Diary, it is the learner's responsibility to replace this book immediately and to update his / her book.
33. Ball games are only allowed during breaks under the supervision of the educator concerned. Ball games to be played on the far side of the field. No cricket bats or balls allowed.



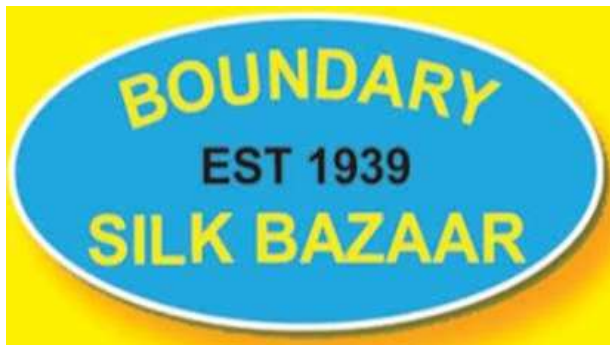

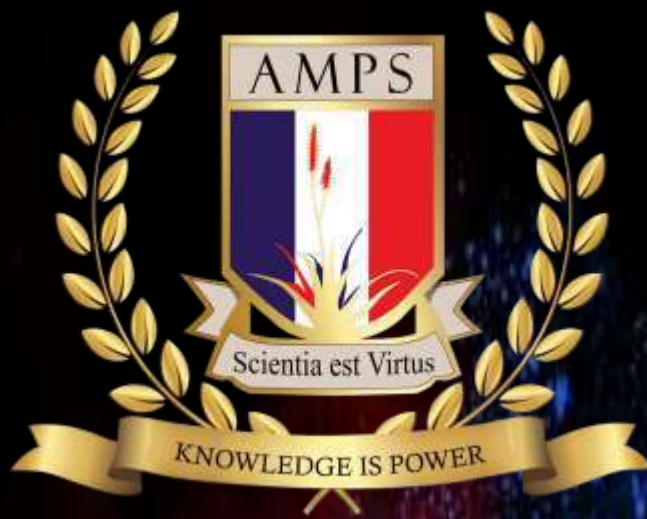
