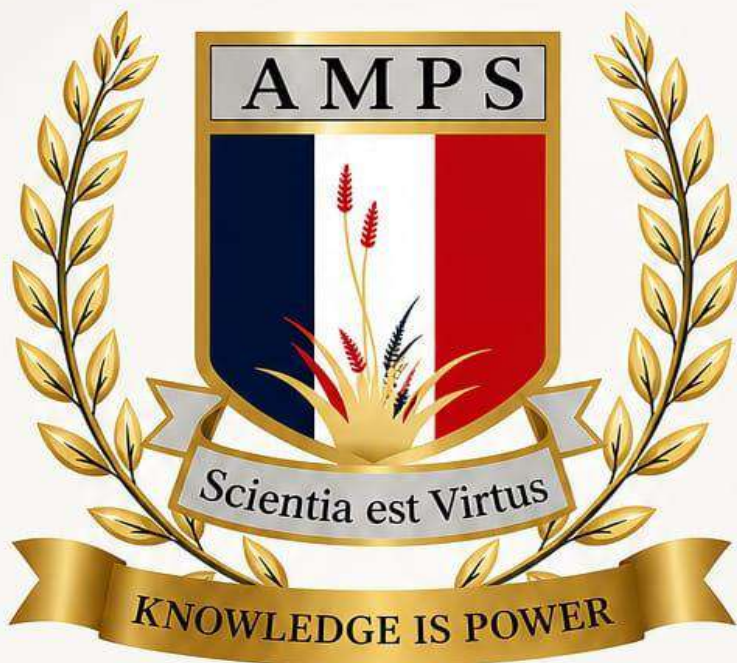

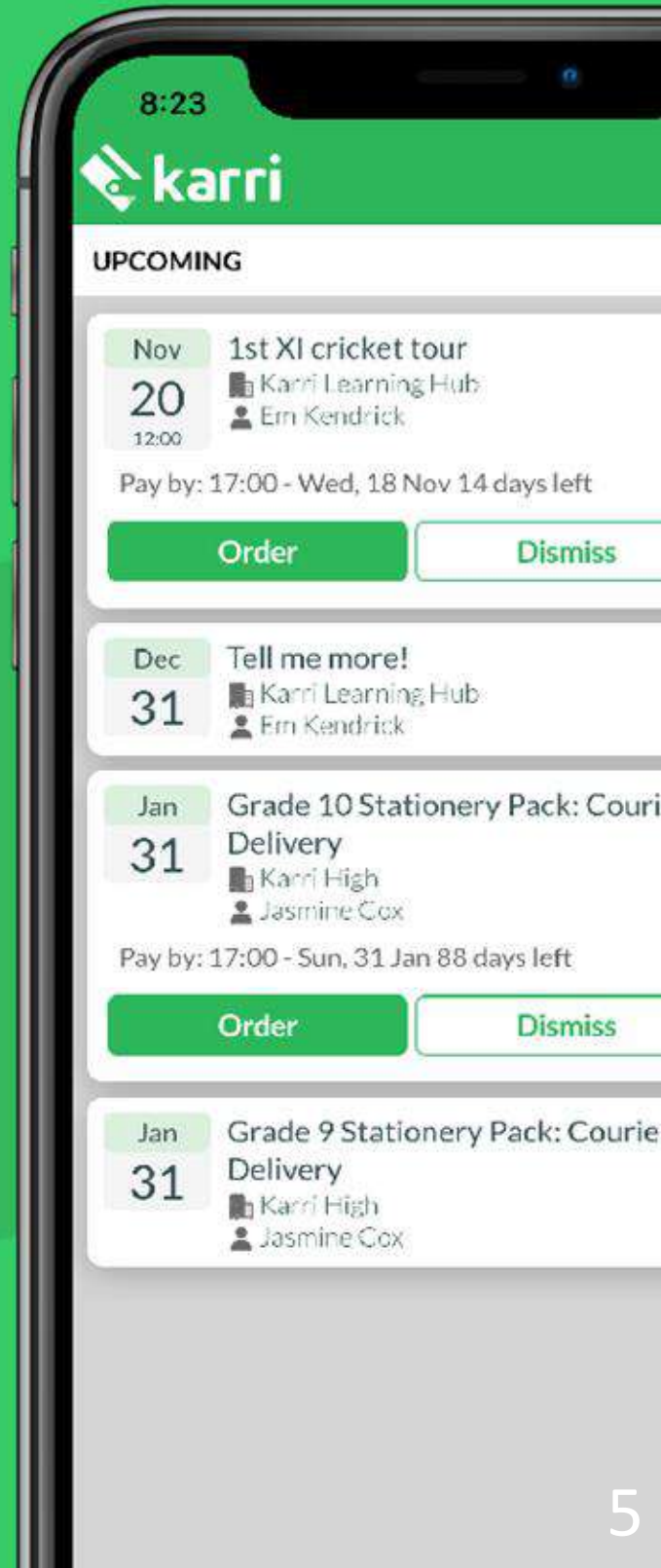

Dear Parents

We are very pleased to introduce you to the **Karri Card**.

A Mastercard for students

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

Opt in process: Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

Fees: Monthly card fees are R39pm for 1 card, R68pm for 2 cards, or R87pm for 3 cards (Incl. VAT). To streamline billing, the first three months will be billed upfront. A 2.5% instant top up fee applies.

Card distribution: Cards will be handed out in class or available at reception on the distribution day. Distribution will take place within about 5 working days after the collection closes. Parents will receive an email when cards are ready.

SA ID required: Due to local regulations, the Karri Card can only be activated by a parent with a SA ID number. Karri is working to offer the card to international parents in the future.

My Responsibilities: What I must do?

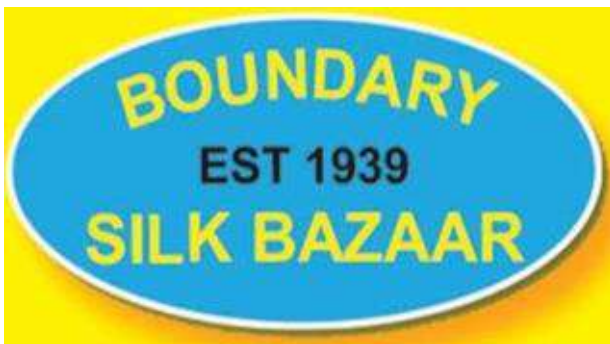
1. I have the responsibility to wear the correct school clothes in the correct colours whenever I am associated with the school, during and after school hours.

First Edition Books

A first edition book is the very first commercially released version of a book, representing the initial appearance of the work before any significant text revisions or layout changes are made. In collecting, the "true first edition" is highly prized, specifically referring to the first printing of that initial edition

What Defines a First Edition?

- **First Printing/Impression:** The very first batch of books produced, often indicated by a number line on the copyright page containing the number "1" (e.g., 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1).
- **True First Edition:** The first time a publisher releases a book. If it sells out and is reprinted without changes, it is a "first edition, second printing".
- **Dust Jacket:** For 20th-century books, the original, intact dust jacket can account for the vast majority of the value.
- **Misprints:** Initial printings sometimes contain errors that are corrected in later, less valuable editions. [1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6]

Examples of Valuable First Edition Books

First editions range from expensive modern classics to extremely rare historical manuscripts.

- **Shakespeare's First Folio (1623):** Sold for over £5 million (R99 million).
- **Leonardo da Vinci's Codex Leicester:** Sold for \$30.8 million (1994), now estimated in excess of \$50 million (R823 million).
- **Alice's Adventures in Wonderland (1865):** Some copies are worth £2–3 million (R45 million).
- **The Great Gatsby (1927):** First editions with original dust jackets can reach roughly £360,000 (R6 million).
- **Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone (1997):** First printing copies (only 500 produced) can fetch over \$90,000 (R1.5 million).
- **The Hobbit (1937):** First editions, particularly in their original dust jacket, can sell for \$260,000 (R4.2 million).
- **Edgar Allan Poe's Tamerlane (1827):** One of only a few known copies sold at Sotheby's New York for \$420,000 in 2024 (R7 million).

How to Identify a First Edition

- **Copyright Page:** Look for "First Edition" or "First Printing" explicitly stated.
- **Number Line:** A sequence of numbers ending in 1 (... 3 2 1) indicates the first printing.
- **Matching Dates:** The year on the title page matches the year on the copyright page.
- **Publisher Knowledge:** Specific publishers have different ways to denote first editions, sometimes using, or sometimes omitting, such information

Factors Affecting Value

1. **Condition:** The book must be in excellent, clean condition. A damaged or missing dust jacket can reduce value by up to 90%.
2. **Rarity:** Small initial print runs mean fewer copies survived.
3. **Author Demand:** Famous authors or seminal, groundbreaking works (like first editions of scientific, political, or literary landmarks) are most in demand.
4. **Signature/Inscription:** Books signed or inscribed by the author can significantly increase in value.
