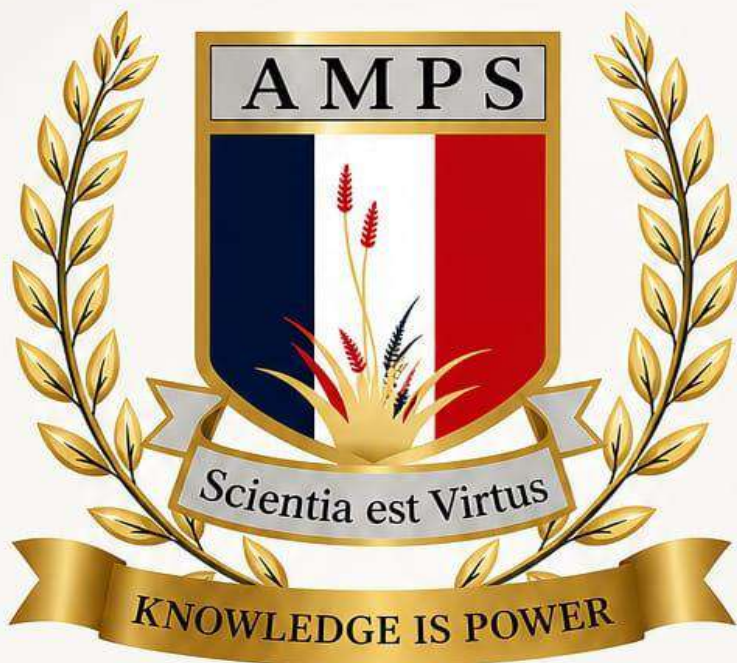

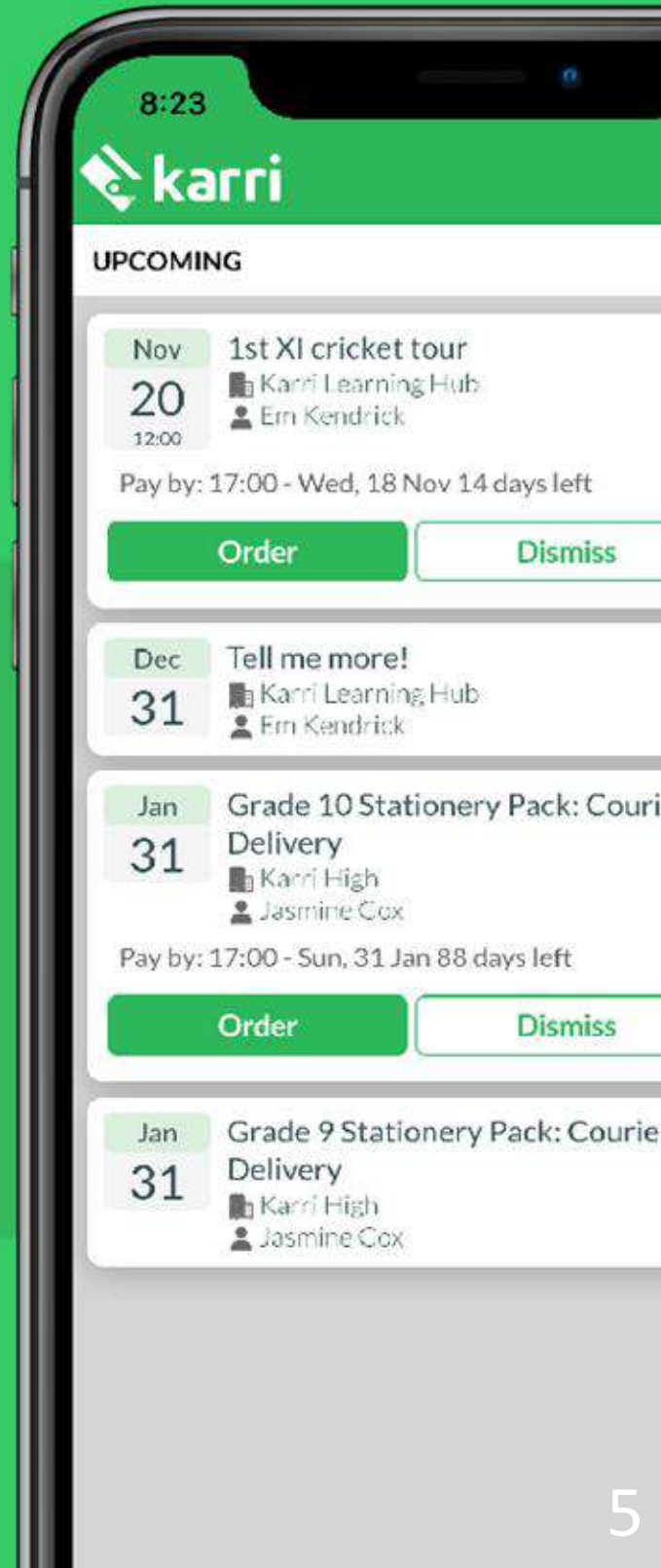

Dear Parents

We are very pleased to introduce you to the **Karri Card**.

A Mastercard for students

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

Opt in process: Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

Fees: Monthly card fees are R39pm for 1 card, R68pm for 2 cards, or R87pm for 3 cards (Incl. VAT). To streamline billing, the first three months will be billed upfront. A 2.5% instant top up fee applies.

Card distribution: Cards will be handed out in class or available at reception on the distribution day. Distribution will take place within about 5 working days after the collection closes. Parents will receive an email when cards are ready.

SA ID required: Due to local regulations, the Karri Card can only be activated by a parent with a SA ID number. Karri is working to offer the card to international parents in the future.

Code of Conduct - Learners

Grade RR - 7 learners are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, page 14 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

Section G: Hairstyles

Boys:

1. Hair must be neat, natural, clean and tidy.
2. Fashion hairstyles such as stencils shaved into hair are not permitted. No exaggerated hairstyles such as comb overs, man buns, mohawks and V-shaped hairlines will be permitted.
3. Boys' hair must be short, it may not touch the ears or eyebrows and must be above the collar without being tied back. Hair must be one length all around - no steps or levels.
4. Kinky or tightly curled hair styled in such a way as to stand out all around the head is not permitted.

Girls:

5. Braided hair (girls only) must be the same colour as the child's natural hair colour.
6. All hair that is shoulder length or unruly hair must be tied back or plaited and the fringe must be out of the face (including braids).
7. Children's hair, eyebrows and eyelashes may not be coloured, shaved or tinted. If hair is coloured during the School holidays, the hair must be returned to the NATURAL, NORMAL colour when School re - opens.
8. Girls' hair accessories may be white OR red OR tartan (same as dress). Plain silver clips are permitted. Colours may not be mixed or matched. Beads may not be worn.

General:

9. Neat hair compliments the uniform and enhances the school's image.
10. Parents will be contacted if management feel that a child's hair is inappropriate and needs to be corrected.



Section H: Accommodation of religious or cultural rights

Religious practices, Conduct or obligation that relate to the core values and beliefs of a recognized religion and that conflict with any rule contained in this code of Conduct will be accommodated by a deviation from this Code of Conduct by the Governing Body.

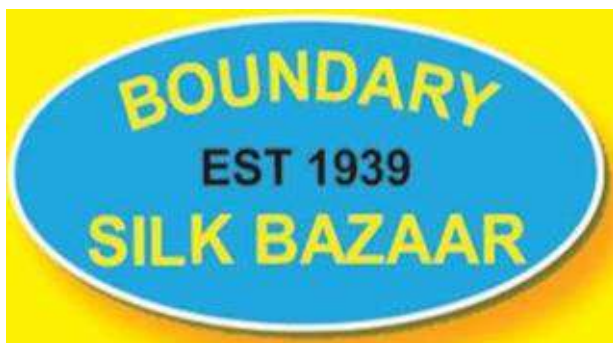
1. The learner assisted by the parent, must apply for a deviation from the standard School rules if such rules conflict with or infringe on any religious right of the learner.
2. The application must be in writing and must identify the specific rule/s that is/are offensive to the learner's religious rights as contained in the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa.
3. The application must include a reasonable interpretation of the religious rights that the learner feels are offensive and a suggestion on how the rules may be supplemented by the Governing Body to accommodate such religious rights.
4. The learner must provide proof that she / he belongs to that specific religion and that the religious practices, rules and obligations that are in conflict with the School's Code of Conduct are his / her true beliefs and commitments.
5. The religious Conduct or practice must be lawful.
6. The School Governing Body must consider the application and, if it is satisfied that the application is justified in terms of Constitutional principles, the application will be granted in writing within 14 days.
7. When the School Governing Body allows for deviations from the standard rules, such deviations must be based on core religious beliefs inherent to the religion, and it must be compulsory for the learner to comply with such beliefs.
8. The deviation must specify the exemption from the normal rules and must clearly identify the Conduct that will be allowed - e.g the wearing of a head scarf.
9. Cultural rights will be considered in the event that they do not relate to a religion, if such cultural rights manifest in conduct of a permanent nature that is compulsory for the cultural group.

While book categorization can be flexible, there are nine widely recognized core genres in genre fiction and publishing:

1. **Romance:** Centers entirely on a love story and the emotional journey of the characters. It traditionally concludes with an emotionally satisfying or optimistic ending.
2. **Fantasy:** Features imaginary worlds, magical elements, mythical creatures, and epic quests, often drawing inspiration from folklore and mythology.
3. **Science Fiction:** Explores speculative, futuristic concepts like advanced technology, time travel, space exploration, and extraterrestrial life. It is grounded in real or scientifically plausible ideas.
4. **Mystery:** Built around a puzzling crime or a secret that the protagonist (often a detective) must solve from start to finish. The reader pieces together the clues alongside the characters.
5. **Thriller:** Dark, fast-paced, and highly suspenseful. These external-action plots revolve around a protagonist trying to achieve a critical, often life-or-death goal while outrunning extreme danger.
6. **Horror:** Intended to frighten, shock, and evoke a sense of dread. While it can involve supernatural entities or curses, it focuses heavily on psychological and physical terror.
7. **Historical Fiction:** Set in a specific, definable time period in the past. It blends real historical events and settings with fictional characters and imagined narratives.

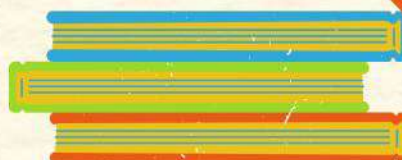
