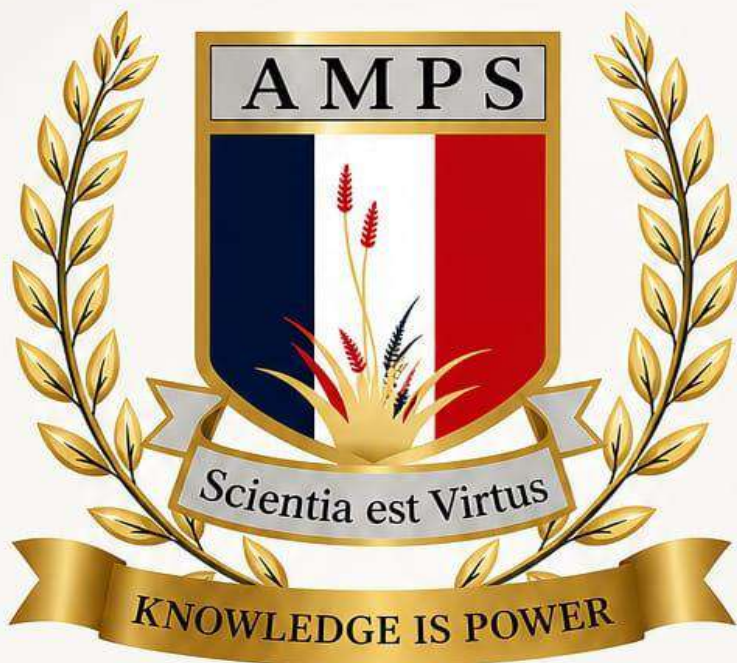

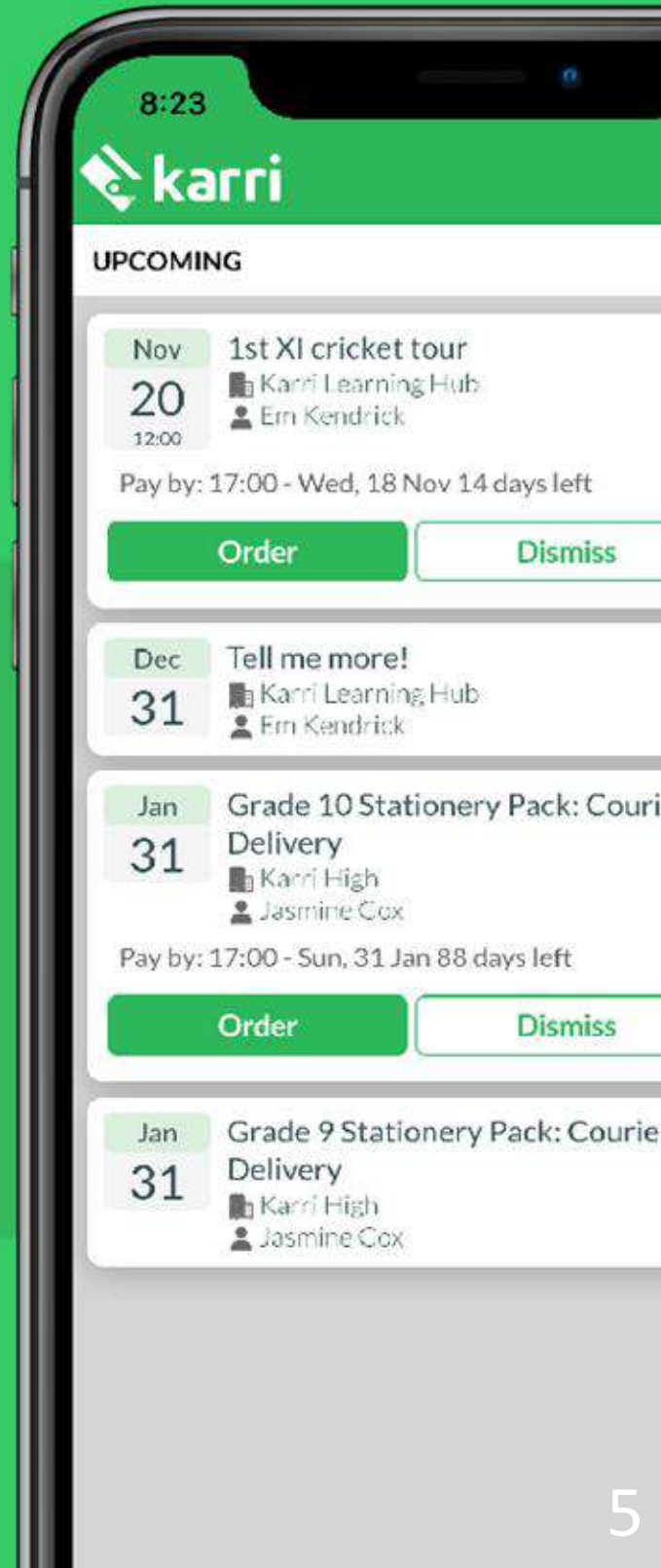

Dear Parents

We are very pleased to introduce you to the **Karri Card**.

### A Mastercard for students

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

**Opt in process:** Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.

**Fees:** Monthly card fees are R39pm for 1 card, R68pm for 2 cards, or R87pm for 3 cards (Incl. VAT). To streamline billing, the first three months will be billed upfront. A 2.5% instant top up fee applies.

**Card distribution:** Cards will be handed out in class or available at reception on the distribution day. Distribution will take place within about 5 working days after the collection closes. Parents will receive an email when cards are ready.

**SA ID required:** Due to local regulations, the Karri Card can only be activated by a parent with a SA ID number. Karri is working to offer the card to international parents in the future.

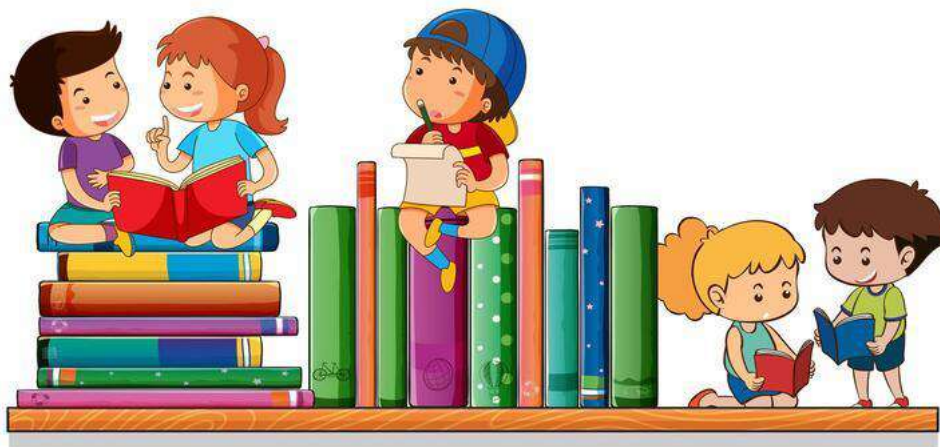
# From the Principal's Office

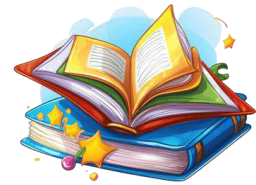
Week 8 of this school term has come to an end and so has the month of May. Grade R - 7 learners started with formal assessments this week and this trend will continue till Wednesday 10 June. Learners are encouraged to sharpen their pencils over the next two weeks in order to get the desired academic results. To study effectively, learners must move away from passive reading and instead use active learning strategies such as the Active Recall method. Learners should focus on testing their memory instead of simply rereading notes. Learners are also encouraged to structure their study sessions using effective time management techniques and to review material over several days to ensure the information is retained. Below are **Active Learning Techniques** that AMPS learners are advised to implement in order to achieve academic success:



- **Blurting:** Read a section of your notes, cover them up, and "blurt" out everything you can remember onto a blank piece of paper. Compare it to your notes to see what you missed, then repeat,
- **The Feynman Technique:** Try explaining the most complex concepts out loud in simple, easy-to-understand terms. Pretend you are teaching it to a ten-year-old.
- **Practice testing:** Use flashcards or old exam papers to force your brain to recall information, which permanently strengthens your memory.

## Code of Conduct - Learners

Grade RR - 7 learners and parents are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, page 15 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

### ***Section J: Absenteeism***

1. A learner may only absent himself / herself from School during a School Day in extraordinary circumstances.
2. Any learner who absents himself / herself from School without a satisfactory excuse will be deemed to be playing truant (bunking), which is strictly forbidden.
3. Unwarranted absence during final assessments cannot and will not be condoned. If a learner is absent from school for an assessment or for a period of two days or more a doctor's letter is required.
4. Absence for a day requires a letter from the parent.
5. It always remains the child's responsibility, to ensure that he / she "catches up" all and any work missed owing to absenteeism.

### ***Section K: Tests and examinations***

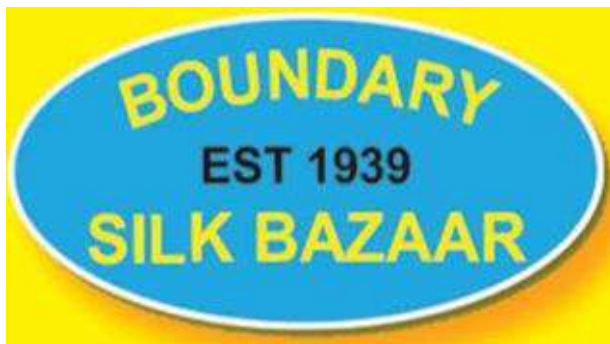
1. Tests and examinations are aimed at assessing a learner's knowledge and understanding of a particular area of learning.
2. All learners are required to submit to tests and examinations set by the professional staff in the course of their professional duty. Failure to comply with this rule may be condoned only in exceptional circumstances fully explained in a note from a learner's parent handed to the Principal at the earliest opportunity possible.
3. Learners shall refrain from communicating with each other in any way or causing any disruption of the peace and quiet required, during any test or examination.
