Code of Conduct – Learners

Grade RR - 7 parents and learners are to please take note of the following provisions in the Code of Conduct for Learners, pages 12 & 13 of the AMPS Homework Diary:

Section A: School Uniform

1. Girls - official summer School uniform = School dress, white School anklets (above the ankle), standard black shoes with black shoelaces or a strap with a buckle.
2. Girls may wear navy short ski pants underneath their dresses - these may not be visible. No boxer shorts to be worn underneath the dress.
3. Learners may wear a plain navy sunhat / cap during the summer months only, but it must be taken off indoors.
4. Boys --official summer School uniform = navy shorts, white shirt with badge, navy School socks with red / white / blue stripe, standard black school shoes with black shoelaces.
5. Winter uniform is the same for both boys and girls. Long navy trousers, long sleeved white School shirt, navy School socks and standard black School shoes as per no. 1 & 4.

Section E: Physical Education Uniform

1. The official School uniform may not be worn with the physical education uniform. The physical education uniform may not replace the formal uniform on other days for any reason.
2. Navy shorts with School badge and AMPS navy sports shirt - ONLY to be worn on the day that the child has physical education.
3. "Takkies" must be a sport shoe - only black OR white OR navy blue. Platform takkies, "heelies", "skater shoes", "Tommy takkies" or brightly coloured / patterned takkies are not permitted.
4. Brightly coloured laces in "takkies" / shoes are not allowed. Laces must be the same colour as the shoe. Shoes must be neatly laced.
5. Learners may only wear the official School tracksuit over their Phys. Ed. uniform in winter on their Phys. Ed. day or if instructed to do so, by a member of staff.



Section J: Absenteeism

1. A learner may only absent himself / herself from School during a School Day in extraordinary circumstances.
2. Any learner who absents himself / herself from School without satisfactory excuse will be deemed to be playing truant (bunking), which is strictly forbidden.
3. Unwarranted absence during final assessments cannot and will not be condoned. If a learner is absent from school for an assessment or for a period of two days or more a doctor's note is required.
4. Absence for a day requires a letter from the parent.
5. It always remains the child's responsibility, to ensure that he / she "catches up" all and any work missed owing to absenteeism.

The Karri Card is an innovative and secure way for parents to manage their child's spending. Children get their name on a bank card and parents get peace of mind through transaction information and controls.

Parents can top-up instantly, block lost cards, reset forgotten PINs and receive spending alerts in real time. Students can pay at South African merchants that accept Mastercard - perfect for purchases **at school** and beyond!

In addition, the Karri Card provides simplicity and control **not offered by a normal bank card**:

- **Sign up easily** without the need for a birth certificate
- Set **daily spending limits**
- Rest easy knowing **inappropriate merchants** such as gambling vendors and liquor retailers are **blocked** (T&Cs for details)
- **Multi-parent functionality** which allows both parents to manage cards

Opt in process: Parents who would like a Karri Card will have the option to opt-in via a Karri collection. Please pay for the collection before the closing date to get your card on the distribution day.
